## Why is Punctuality important?

Just 10 minutes late a day means that your child will have missed over a week of learning over the year

Late arrival means your child will miss key learning for the day

Late arrivals may result in families being issued with a fixed penalty notice Children can feel embarrassed arriving in class after learning has already started

If children arrive after the register closes at 9.30am it will be marked as an unauthorised absence

Children need to be collected promptly at the end of the school day

It instills good habits for now and in the future

Remember to ensure your child arrives on time so they don't miss out!

> Your child should arrive at school for 8.45am Registers close at 9.00am
