

Maths

In Maths this half term we will be exploring the concepts of money and time.

The children will revisit their learning on coins and values of money before looking at adding money, working out the change and working out the difference between prices (subtracting money).

When we learn about time, we will look at telling the time in the am and pm, telling the time to the minute, using analogue and digital time and telling the time using both the minute and hour hands. We will then learn to use the 24 hour clock and clocks using Roman numerals. Finally, we will use our knowledge of time to measure and compare time, finding start times and end times and then converting units of time.

Science/Humanities

Science: Forces and magnets

Wonderful water: Ancient civilisations and Egypt. Why build towns near water?

History: Ancient Egypt - why was the River Nile so important and how would Egyptians have travelled on it? We will then compare Ancient Egypt to other Ancient Civilisations.

Geography: Exploring the weather in the UK and how this may compare to weather in Egypt.
