Look what we enjoyed this week

Pre-school have welcomed some new friends this term! we have had lots of fun getting to know each other and a brilliant first week back.

FS2 are channelling their inner artists, taking inspiration from Chelsey Bonestell's work to create our own space themed paintings and have had fun in the sun during this weeks forest school session.

Year 1 have enjoyed watching our caterpillars grow into butterflies. We have been to forest school to release them and watch them fly away!

Year 2 are focussing so hard building their 3D shapes. They used their prior knowledge to help with the number of vertices and edges.

Year 3 have especially enjoyed peeling, grating and cutting to make their chutney in cooking.

Year 4 are investigating the effects of liquids on tooth decay. We have used different types of drinks to test which one makes teeth decay faster. We are also starting our new topic about fractions we are excited to build on our prior knowledge from year 2 and 3!

Year 5 have been learning about forces and we have started our new text 'holes'. We've also been looking forward to our trip to Tatton Park.

Year 6 have been working hard at making joints in preparation to making their Anderson shelters in DT and learning about Parliament and preparing questions to ask our local MP Angela Eagle when she visits school next week. Well done to Y6 for their efforts and focus during their SATS familiarisation morning.

Nurture class have really enjoyed experimenting with different watercolour techniques. We used a very exciting powder paint called Brusho that created such an unexpected and vibrant effect.
