Look what we have enjoyed this week...

Pre-school have had lots of fun role-playing a vet clinic this week! They have thoroughly enjoyed playing all together and bringing different parts to life, there were receptionists, animals and vets!

FS2 have really enjoyed learning all about how palaeontologists use their discoveries to show what skeletons might have looked like long ago. They have made our own fossils and designed their own unique dinosaur skeletons using a range of materials. The children also enjoyed showing their grown ups some super learning in our Family session. Thank you to all who joined FS2 for this.

Year 1 have been blowing us away with their knowledge about animals! They have learnt new key vocabulary - herbivore, omnivore and carnivore and have started trying to sort animals into these categories.

Year 3 have had another busy week! They have continued to learn about Egypt and the Ancient Egyptians. They have continued their science learning on balanced diets and have explored what is in the food that we eat. They have continued their descriptive writing and have started to collect ideas ready to describe the setting in their own story. Class 8 have been building their scarab beetles using the slab technique and Class 7 are excited for their turn next week.

Year 4 were very excited to launch their new text (How to train your dragon) this week and even had a tweet from the author, Cressida Cowell! They also learned how to multiply using the column method and in History, thought of questions they would like to find out the answers to about the Vikings!

Year 5 are working super hard on their letter writing this week! They started the week with a delicious cake to share between the class to recap their learning of fractions. They enjoyed developing invasion skills further and we are proud of our Year Fives, who competed in the tag rugby tournament. Well done Year Five!

Year 6 have been busy using their writing skills to create a police missing persons report linked to their class text 'Letters from the Lighthouse.' They have also visited Christ Church and spoke to Ron regarding the Eucharist and Holy Communion.

Nurture class have been learning how to recognise when their friends need help and what they can do. They have also been adding tens and ones to make larger numbers.
