The highlight of our week was visiting church to deepen our understanding of the Easter story, exploring Holy Week with Reverend Ron and the Church

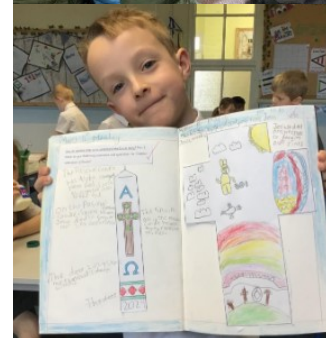

The rest of the week included learning about time in maths and investigating magnetism in science.

Year 4 had such a wonderful time experiencing Easter this week. We went to church and we travelled along the journey that Jesus took and loved sharing our thoughts and reflections. Thank you so much to Ron and his team! The children have also enjoyed reading letters from their pen pals from Oxton St Saviour's... we are now preparing our replies!

Year 5 had a fantastic time on our school trip to Speke Hall looking round the gardens and their amazing Tudor house! The rest of the week we have been designing Tudor flags, that we will eventually stitch ourselves. We have also been working hard learning about decimals in maths lessons.

Year 6 have been looking at the cities targeted by the Germans during World War II and done some research into reasons for the start of the war. The children enjoyed visiting Christ Church for their Easter Experience and are getting very excited about their residence to Condoover Hall next week.
